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The name GUM in German literally means



great universal store, and dates back to its inauguration in 1893. Today GUM is probably one of the first names to come to mind when thinking of Russia. Built on behalf of the Russian Tsar by the architect



A. Pomeranzew in the period 1888 to 1893, it is located directly in the tourist centre of Moscow on Red Square, opposite the Lenin Mausoleum and Kremlin. The architecturally magnificent building is 250 m long and 88 m wide, and comprises three arcades with two floors each, where hundreds of shops from all important international brand names such as Gucci, Benetton etc. can be found. Ten years after stock market floatation in 1992, GUM now has plans to open branches in nine other cities by 2006.



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
